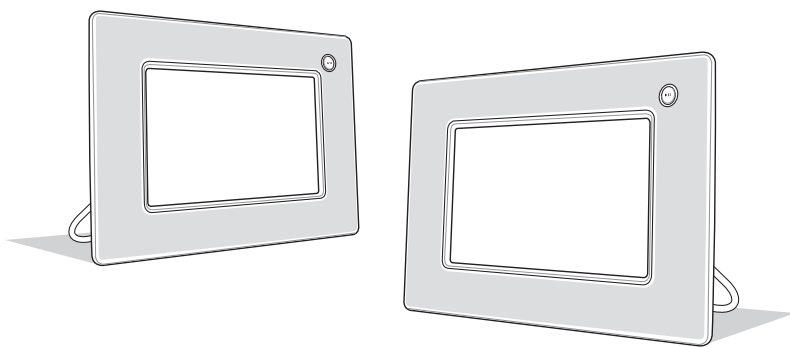

## Care & Cleaning

- Follow the correct lifting techniques when positioning uFOTO. Grasp the edges when lifting or carrying uFOTO.
- Turn your uFOTO off and unplug the power cord before cleaning. Clean the surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Stains may be removed with a cloth dampened with mild cleaner.
- Avoid using a cleaner containing alcohol or acetone. Use a cleaner intended for use with the LCD. Never spray cleaner directly on the screen, as it may drip inside device and cause an electric shock.

### **The following indications are normal with uFOTO:**

- The screen may flicker during the initial use due to the nature of the fluorescent light. When this happens, turn off the power switch then turn the device back on.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching images. The screen will recover slowly or you can also reset the device.
- If you encounter a problem with your device, contact your retailer. Do not attempt to repair the device yourself.

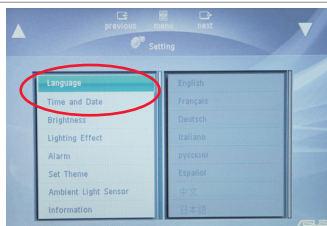
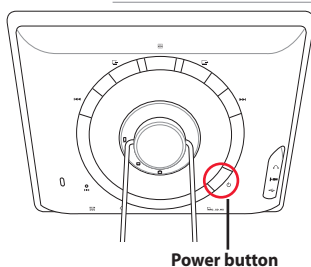
# Using your uFOTO for the first time

## Setting language and time/date

1. Press  or  to turn on the device.
2. Go to Setting menu.
3. Select Language to set preferred language.
4. Select Time and Date to set time and date.



 is for quick power on only; you cannot press  turn off the device. Press  to turn on or off your uFOTO normally.



## Installing the ASUS uFOTO Utility

The ASUS uFOTO Utility contains two functions: data synchronization and sub-display. To normally use the functions, make sure to install the ASUS uFOTO Utility successfully.

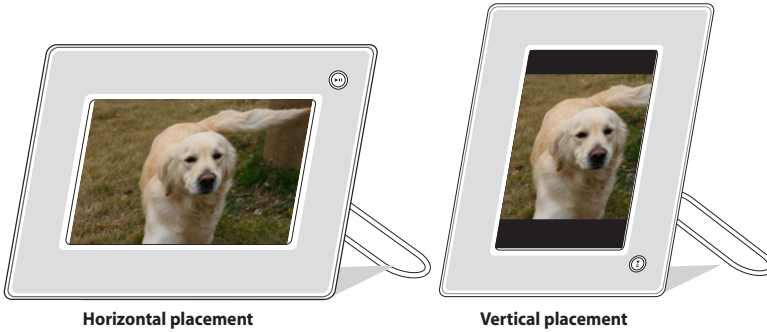
To install the **ASUS uFOTO Utility**:

1. Insert the support CD into the optical drive.
2. Double-click the **ASUS uFOTO Utility** icon, then follow the on-screen instructions to finish the installation.
3. Restart your computer after the installation.



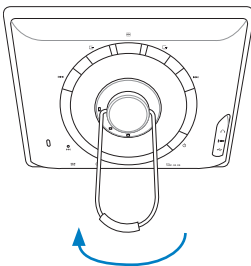
## uFOTO placement

With a rotating support stand, you can conveniently position your uFOTO either vertically or horizontally on a stable and flat surface.

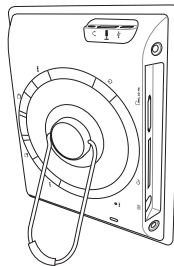


The display automatically rotates 90 degrees clockwise depending on your preferred orientation.

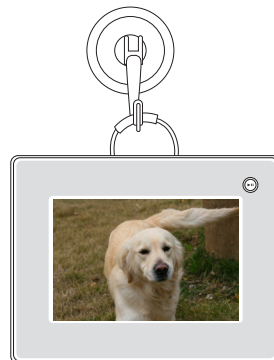
## Adjust the support stand:



Rotate the support stand clockwise to adjust and support vertical or horizontal placement.

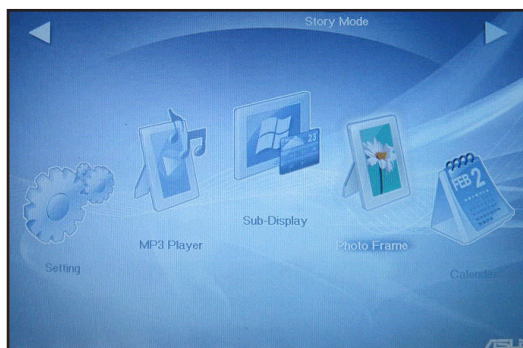

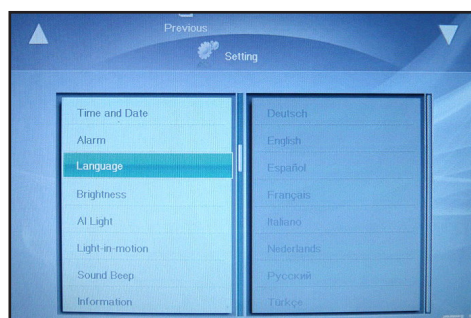
## Screen menu

uFOTO provides several visual and audio functions such as viewing photos, listening to mp3s, displaying digital calendar, and using the Sub-Display.



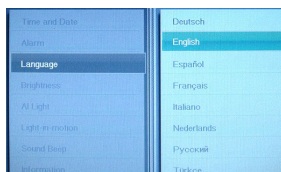
## Setting your uFOTO

Configure several basic settings from the Setting function. From the main menu, use ◀ or ▶ to select the **Setting** icon , and press the confirm button (⏻) to enter.



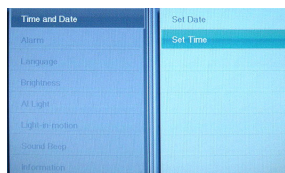
## Languages

From the Setting menu, use ◀◀ and ▶▶ to select the Language item, then press Ⓢ to enter. Highlight your desired language from the list of supported languages, then press Ⓢ to confirm the selection.



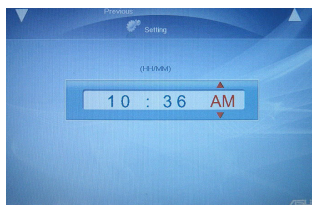
## Time and Date

### To set the time:

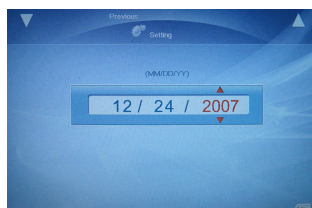

### To display images from "My uFOTO Picture" folder in your computer (Sub-Display function):

### Previewing photos



1. From the main menu, use ◀◀ or ▶▶ to select , then press ⏻ to enter.
2. Select the photo source, then press ⏻ to view the browsing screen.
3. In the browsing screen, press ◀◀ and ▶▶ to select a photo, then press ⏻ to display the full view.

While viewing the selected photo, you can switch to the previous or next one pressing press ◀◀ and ▶▶.

Pressing ⏻ allows you to switch between the Slideshow mode or the Browse mode.


### Changing photo sequence

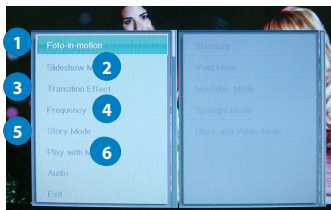
#### To change the photo display sequence:

1. In the browsing screen, use ◀◀ or ▶▶ to highlight a photo, then press  to check the checkbox below the photo.
2. Press , then use ◀◀ or ▶▶ to highlight the item **Move Forward / Move Backward** as you want.
3. Press ⏻ to confirm the setting.



## Adjusting effects

While viewing the selected photo, press  to configure the following settings:



### 1 Foto-in-motion

Displays your photos in five different modes.

- **Standard:** provides balanced user comforts and color enrichment.
- **Vivid mode:** enhances saturation and contrast for a more saturated color.
- **Nostalgic Mode:** displays photos in old picture style.
- **Spotlight Mode:** enhances color sharpness and strong contrast.
- **Black and White Mode:** displays photos in black and white.

### 2 Slideshow Mode

Auto-display your photos in order, saving you from clicking on each photo.

### 3 Transition Effect

Provides you several transition effects.

### 4 Frequency

Allows you to set the photo transition frequency .

### 5 Story Mode

A built-in photo demonstration combined with music background.

### 6 Play with MP3

Allows you to select the desired music from your storage device while viewing photos.

## 7 MP3 Menu

Allows you to adjust the volume and playback mode for the currently playing MP3 file.

### Copying photos to your uFOTO

You can copy your favorite photos from your memory card, USB device, PC, or Notebook to the uFOTO.

- When stored in the internal memory of the uFOTO, the photos are automatically resized into a 720 x 480 resolution.
- The operating system of your uFOTO takes around 28MB of the total internal memory.
- 100MB allows you to store over 700 photos.

4. Select the storage source where you want to paste the copied photos, then press  to confirm.

## Deleting photos from your uFOTO

## Listening to MP3s

Enjoy with your uFOTO! uFOTO can play music files from your memory card, USB device, or **My uFOTO Music** folder in your computer.

From the main menu, use ◀◀ and ▶▶ to select , and press ⏻ to enter.

The uFOTO only supports files of **.mp3** format.

### To play music from your personal memory card:

1. Insert your memory card with MP3 files into the corresponding slot.

### To play music from your USB device:

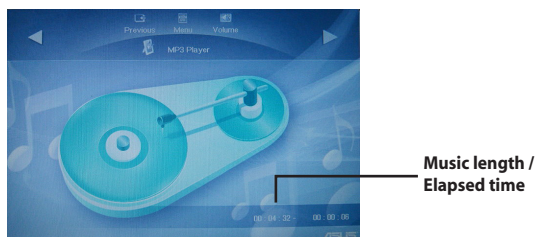

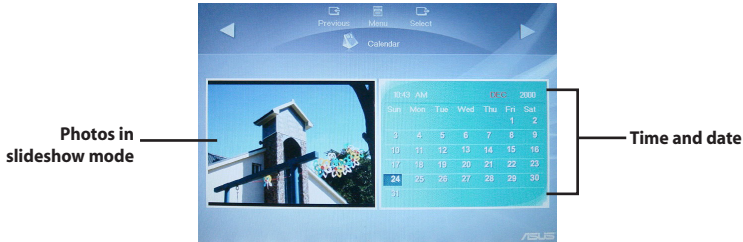

## Calendar

From the Calendar screen, press , then follow the steps in **Viewing photos** to display photos.

### Configuring Calendar settings

From the Calendar screen, press  to configure several settings for photo display and music playback.

- 1 Slideshow Mode**  
Allows you to disable the slideshow mode or set to sequential / random mode.
- 2 Transition Effect**  
Provides you several transition effects.
- 3 Frequency**  
Allows you to set the photo transition frequency .
- 4 Play with MP3**  
Allows you to select the desired music from your storage device while displaying the calendar and photos.
- 5 Photo Source**  
Allows you to select a storage device where photos are located.

**6 Reminiscence**

A shortcut to the Reminiscence function. Refer to the next section **Reminiscence** for more details.

**7 Sub/Full Screen Mode**

Allows you to display the calendar in **Sub Screen** or **Full Screen**.

**8 MP3 Menu**

Allows you to adjust the volume and playback mode for the currently playing MP3 file.

**Reminiscence**

The Reminiscence function allows you to search for a photo according to the date when the photo was taken.

Use ◀◀ and ▶▶ to select the field (mm / dd / yyyy) and change the values. Press ⏹ to confirm the setting.





## Software introduction

To install the **ASUS uFOTO Utility**:

1. Insert the support CD into the optical drive.
2. Double-click the **ASUS uFOTO Utility** icon, then follow the on-screen instructions to finish the installation.
3. Restart your computer after the installation.

### Data synchronization

The synchronization function makes it a lot easier and faster to pass photos and MP3 files to your uFOTO.

### To synchronize data:

1. Connect your uFOTO with your computer using the bundled USB cable.
2. Select **Mass Storage**, then press **⏮** to enter.
3. Double-click the **ASUS uFOTO Utility** icon on the computer desktop to start the **ASUS uFOTO Folder Sync utility**.
4. Copy your favorite MP3 files to the **My uFOTO Music** folder and photos to the **My uFOTO Picture** folder.

### Sub-Display

uFOTO can be used as a second screen to your computer and display the instant information windows or message tools you want.




---

Before using this function, make sure that you have installed the **ASUS uFOTO Utility**.

---

### To start the Sub-Display utility:

1. Connect your uFOTO with your computer using the bundled USB cable.
2. Select **Sub-Display**, then press  to enter.
3. Double-click **Sub-Display** on the computer desktop to start the **ASUS Sub-Display Utility**.




### To use the Sub-Display functions:

When the utility is activated, the same display is shown both on your computer and on your uFOTO.



### Adjusting the screen

Press the following buttons to adjust the viewing screen.

-  and  : to zoom in or zoom out.
-  : to fit the screen in proportion.
- **1:1** : to display the screen in original proportion.

### Selecting your ideal Sub-Display mode

The Sub-Display utility offers three kinds of viewing modes. You can decide which mode to use under different circumstances.

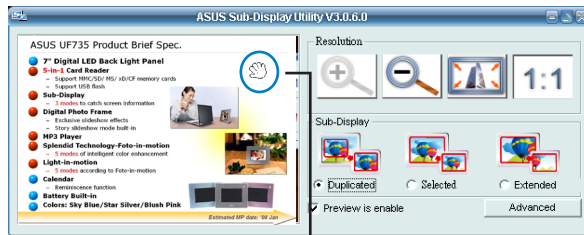


The Sub-Display function supports only the Duplication mode and Selection mode under Windows® Vista operating system.

### Duplication mode

Make uFOTO your second display by selecting this mode. You will see the same movements simultaneously while editing a word, deleting a file, writing a sentence, etc.

When you select the Duplication mode, the screen on your computer is duplicated to your uFOTO.



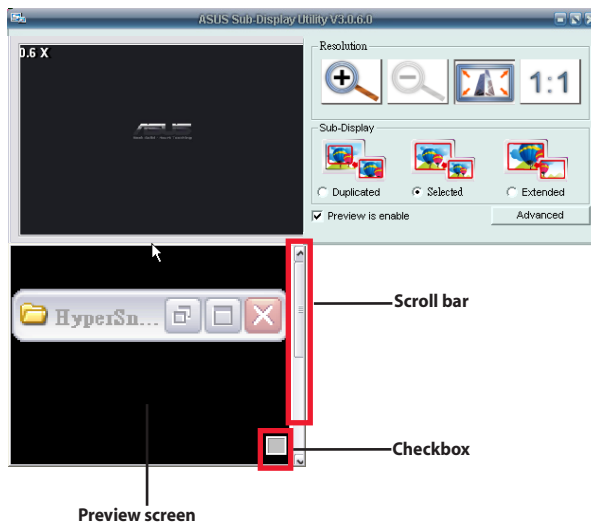
Hand-shaped cursor

Adjust the position of the screen by dragging the screen with the hand-shaped cursor.

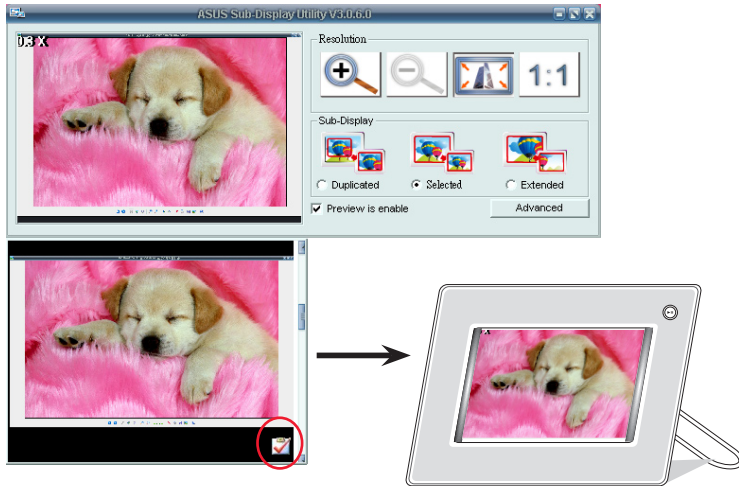


### Selection mode

Move the scroll bar in the preview screen to select the window you want to display on the uFOTO.

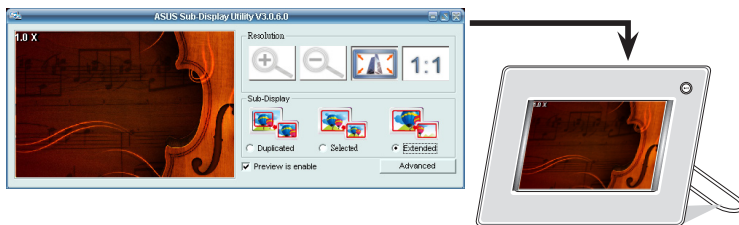


After selecting the window, check the checkbox on the down right side of the preview screen.

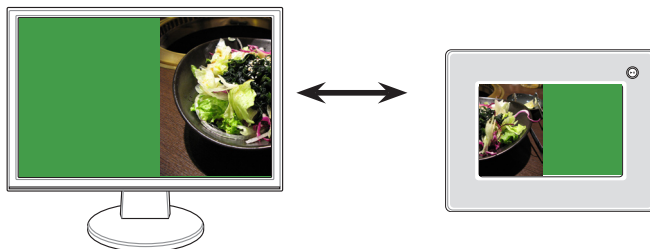


### Extension mode

When enabling the extension mode, you can hide the current viewing window by dragging it outside of the computer desktop window. Adjust the position of the window on your uFOTO by dragging the same screen with the hand-shaped cursor in the control panel.



You can also extend part of the current viewing window to your uFOTO.

Click Advanced to adjust the settings including Image Adjustment and Display Setting.

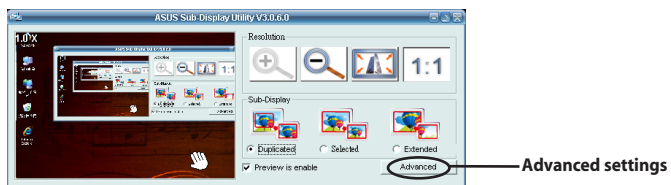
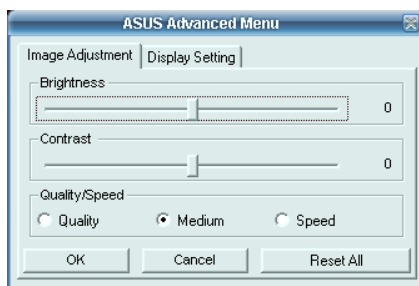
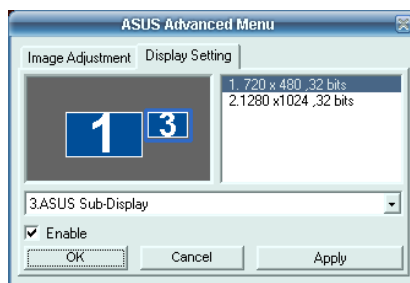

# Troubleshooting (FAQ)

Problem	Possible Solution
uFOTO does not turn on	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Check if the adaptor is properly plugged.</li><li>• Check if your uFOTO is fully charged.</li></ul>
The battery remaining indicator is incorrect	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The phenomenon occurs when you are using your uFOTO in an extremely hot or cold environment.</li><li>• The displayed battery remaining differ from the current one. Fully discharge and then recharge the built-in battery to correct the display.</li><li>• The built-in battery is discharged. Plug the adaptor into your uFOTO for charging.</li></ul>
I cannot launch the Sub-Display function	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The USB cable is not well connected.</li><li>• The ASUS uFOTO utility is not completely installed. Refer to page 2-19 and re-install the utility.</li><li>• The Sub-Display function cannot work with the Mass Storage mode simultaneously. Make sure that you are not in the Mass Storage mode prior to launching the Sub-Display function.</li></ul>
I cannot import photos or MP3 files uFOTO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The internal memory is full. Remove some files from your uFOTO.</li></ul>
The LCD brightness is not stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Check if the AI Light function is enabled. If you enable this function, the LCD backlight will auto-adjust according to the surrounding environments.</li></ul>
