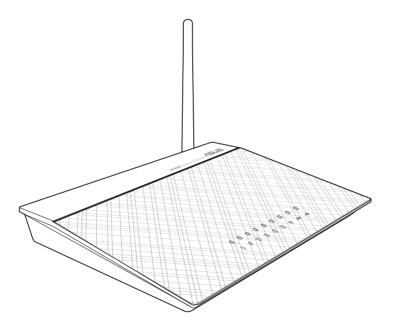

## System requirements

Before installing the ASUS Wireless Router, ensure that your system/network meets the following requirements:

- An Ethernet RJ-45 port (10Base-T/100Base-TX)
- At least one IEEE 802.11b/g/n device with wireless capability
- An installed TCP/IP and Internet browser





## Before you proceed

Take note of the following guidelines before installing the ASUS Wireless Router:

- The length of the Ethernet cable that connects the device to the network (hub, ADSL/cable modem, router, wall patch) must not exceed 100 meters.
- Place the device on a flat and stable surface as far from the ground as possible.
- Keep the device clear from metal obstructions and away from direct sunlight.
- Keep the device away from transformers, heavy-duty motors, fluorescent lights, microwave ovens, refrigerators, and other industrial equipment to prevent signal loss.
- Place the device at the center of the network to provide ideal coverage for all wireless mobile devices.
- Install the device at least 20cm away from the user in accordance with the RF Guidelines for Human Exposure adopted by the Federal Communications Commission.



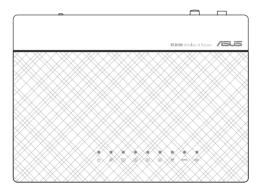

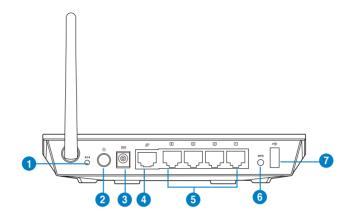

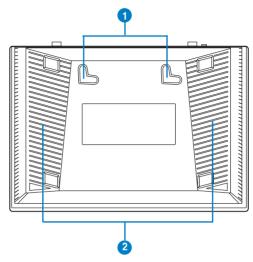


Item	Description
1	Reset button Press this button for more than five seconds to reset the system to its factory default settings.
2	Power switch Press this button to turn the power on/off.
3	Power (DC-In) port Insert the AC adapter into this port to connect your router to a power source.
4	WAN port Connect an RJ-45 Ethernet cable to this port to establish WAN connection.
5	LAN 1 ~ 4 ports  Connect RJ-45 Ethernet cables to these ports to establish LAN connection.
6	WPS button Press this button to establish wireless connection.
7	USB 2.0 port Insert a USB device into this port.





## **Bottom panel**



Item	Description
1	Mounting hooks Use the mounting hooks to mount your router on concrete or wooden surfaces using two round head screws.
2	Air vents These vents provide ventilation to your router.

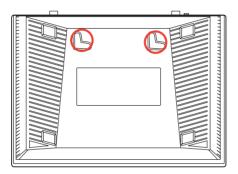

## **Mounting options**

The ASUS Router is designed to sit on a raised flat surface like a file cabinet or book shelf. The unit may also be mounted to a wall or ceiling.

#### To mount the ASUS Router:

- 1. Look for the two mounting hooks underneath the router.
- 2. Mark two upper holes on a flat surface.
- 3. Screw on two round head screws on the surface until only 1/4" is showing.
- 4. Latch the hooks of the ASUS Router onto the screws.

Re-adjust the screws if you cannot latch the ASUS Wireless Router onto the screws or if the fit is too loose.

## Setting up the wireless router

The ASUS Wireless Router includes a web graphical user interface (web GUI) that allows you to configure the wireless router using your web browser.



For details on configuring your wireless router using the web GUI, refer to Chapter 4: Network configuration using the web GUI.

## Using the Quick Internet Setup (QIS) Using QIS with auto-detection

The Quick Internet Setup (QIS) feature guides you in quickly setting up your Internet connection.

#### To use QIS with auto-detection:

 Launch a web browser such as Internet Explorer, Mozilla Firefox, Safari, or Google Chrome. Manually key in the wireless router's default IP address: http://192.168.1.1









Use the default username (admin) and password (admin) to log into the user interface.



3. The wireless router automatically detects if your ISP connection type is **Dynamic IP, PPPoE, PPTP, L2TP**, and **Static IP**. Key in the necessary information for your ISP connection type.

## Accessing the wireless router

#### Setting an IP address for wired or wireless clients

To access the ASUS Wireless Router, you must have the correct TCP/IP settings on your wired or wireless clients. Ensure that the clients' IP addresses are within the same subnet as the ASUS Wireless Router.

By default, the ASUS Wireless Router uses DHCP to automatically assign IP addresses to the clients in your network.

You may, however, want to manually assign static IP addresses on some of the clients or computers in your network rather than automatically getting IP addresses from your wireless router.

Follow the instructions below that correspond to the operating system installed on your client or computer.



In the Router mode, if you want to manually assign an IP address to your client, we recommend that you use the following settings:

- IP address: 192.168.1.xxx (xxx can be any number between 2 and 254. The IP address should not used by another device)
- Subnet Mask: 255.255.255.0 (same as the ASUS Wireless Router)
- Gateway: 192.168.1.1 (IP address of the ASUS Wireless Router)
- DNS: 192.168.1.1 (ASUS Wireless Router) or assign a known DNS server in your network

## Configuration via the web GUI

The router's web graphics user interface (web GUI) allows you to access additional features inluded with the wireless router.

#### To access the web GUI:

1. Launch a web browser, then key in the router's IP address.



- · In Router mode, the router's IP address is 192.168.1.1.
- In AP mode, use Device Discovery included in the support CD to find the router's IP address
- On the login page, key in the default user name (admin) and password (admin).

## **Using the Network Map**

Network Map allows you to view the status of the Internet, system, and clients in your network. It enables you to quickly set up your Wide Area Network (WAN) using the Quick Internet Setup (QIS) feature.

To view the status or configure network settings, click any of these icons displayed on the Network Map page:

Icon	Description
	Internet status  Click this icon to display information on the Internet connection status, WAN IP address, DNS, connection type, and gateway address. From the Internet status screen, use the Quick Internet Setup (QIS) feature to quickly set up your WAN.
	Security level Click this icon to display information on the SSID, authentication and encryption methods, LAN IP, and MAC address. Click Wireless on the left navigation panel to enable the WPS mode.
	Client status  Click this icon to display information about the clients or computers in the network, and allows you to block/unblock a client.
	USB device status Click this icon to display information about your USB device.

**Creating your Guest Network** 

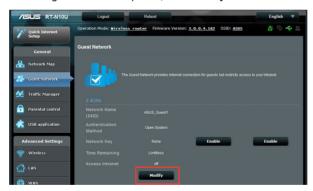
Setting up a Guest Network provides wireless Internet connectivity for temporary visitors while restricting access to your private network.

#### To create your guest network:

- 1. Click **Guest Network** on the left navigation panel.
- Click Enable.

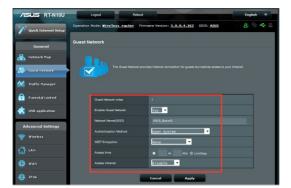

- Assign a wireless name for your temporary network on the Network Name (SSID) field.
- 6. Select an Authentication Method.
- 7. Select a WEP Encryption method.

## **Using the Traffic Manager**

### Managing QoS (Quality of Service) Bandwidth

The **Quality of Service** feature allows you to set the bandwidth priority and manage network traffic.

#### To set up bandwidth priority:

- 1. Click **Traffic Manager** on the left navigation panel and click the **QoS** tab.
- 2. Click ON to enable QoS. Fill in the upload and download bandwidth fields.
- 3. Click Save.



Your bandwidth information is available from your ISP.

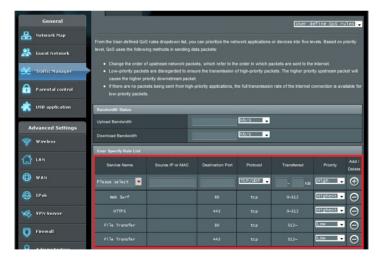

The Operation Mode page allows you to set up your wireless router into any of the three modes: Router mode, Repeater mode, or Access Point mode.

#### **Router Mode**

To set up the wireless router in Router mode:

- Click Administration on the navigation panel and click the Operation Mode tab. Select Wireless router mode. Click Save.
- Select your connection from these types of ISP services: Dynamic IP, PPPoE, PPTP, L2TP, and Static IP.



- 3. Key in the required information of your selected connection type.
- 4. Click Apply to save settings.

1. Click **Administration** on the navigation panel and click the **Operation Mode** tab. Select Repeater mode. Click Save.

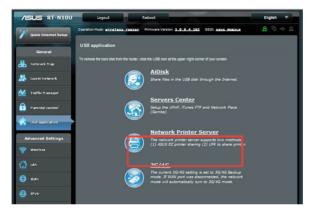
## **Using 3G/4G Sharing Mode**



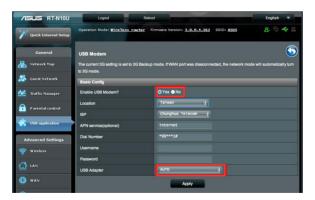
The ASUSWRT user interface does not support PIN code input. If the SIM card was previously set with a PIN code, use your mobile phone or a compatible wireless USB dongle to disable the PIN code.

#### To set up the wireless router in 3G/4G Sharing mode:

1. Click **USB application** on the left navigation panel and click the 3G/4G icon.



- 2. On the USB Modem configuration page, click **Yes** for Enable USB Modem.
- On the USB Adapter item, select your USB adapter's model name. If the model name is not listed, select AUTO.

4. Select the Location and ISP for your service. Key in the APN, Dial Number,

**Username**, and **Password** if necessary.



Please refer to your Internet service provider or telecommunications service for the necessary values for the 3G/4G items.

## **Setting up the DHCP Server**

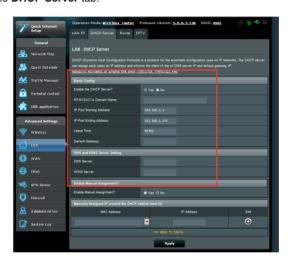
You wireless router uses DHCP to assign IP addresses automatically on your network. You can specify the IP address range and lease time for the clients on your network.



The ASUS wireless router can support up to 253 IP addresses on your network.

#### To configure the DHCP server:

- 1. Click LAN on the left navigation panel.
- 2. Click the DHCP Server tab.



- 3. In the Enable the DHCP Server? field, tick Yes.
- 4. In the IP Pool Starting Address field, key in the starting IP address.
- 5. In the IP Pool Ending Address field, key in the ending IP address.
- In the Lease Time field, specify in seconds when an assigned IP address will expire. Once it reaches this time limit, the DHCP server will then assign a new IP address.



 ASUS recommeds that you use an IP address format of 192.168.1.xxx (where xxx can be any number between 2 and 254) when specifying an IP address range.

· An IP Pool Starting Address should not be greater than the IP Pool Ending Address.





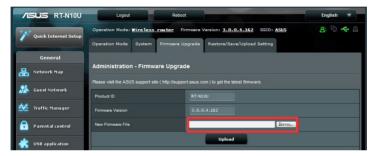
## **Upgrading the firmware**



Download the latest firmware from the ASUS website at http://www.asus.com

#### To upgrade the firmware:

- 1. Click **Administration** from the left navigation panel.
- 2. Click the Firmware Upgrade tab.
- In the New Firmware File item, click Browse. Navigate to the downloaded firmware file.
- 4. Click Upload.





If the upgrade process fails, the wireless router automatically enters rescue mode and the power LED indicator on the front panel starts flashing slowly. To recover or restore the system, use the Firmware Restoration utility.



## Restoring/Saving/Uploading settings

#### To restore/save/upload the settings:

- 1. Click **Advanced Setting** from the left navigation panel.
- 2. Click the Restore/Save/Upload Setting tab.



- 3. Select the tasks that you want to do:
  - To restore to the default factory settings, click Restore, and click OK once prompted.
  - To save the current system settings, click Save, navigate to the folder where you intend to save the file and click Save.
  - To restore from a saved system settings file, click Browse to locate your file, then click Upload.

The USB Extension menu provides AiDisk, Servers Center, Network Printer Server and 3G/4G submenus.

AiDisk allows you to share files stored in a connected USB storage device through the Internet.

#### To use AiDisk:

- 1. Click **USB** application on the left navigation panel and click the **AiDisk icon**.
- 2. From the Welcome to AiDisk wizard screen, click Go.



 Assign access rights to the USB storage device. Select limitless access rights, limited access rights, and admin access to define read-right privileges to files stored in the USB storage device. Click Next.







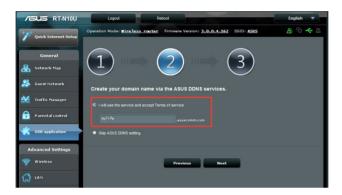

- 4. To set up your domain name via the ASUS DDNS service, select I will use the service and accept Terms of service and key in your preferred domain name. Your domain name will follow the format xxx.asuscomm.com, where xxx is your host name. For example, myfiles.asuscomm.com.
- 5. Click Next.



- 6. Click Finish.
- To access the USB storage device via FTP from a client on the network, launch a web browser or a third-party FTP client utility and key in the ftp link (ftp://chostname>.asuscomm.com) you previously created. For example, ftp://myfiles.asuscomm.com.









### Using the Network Place (Samba) Share service

Network Place (Samba) Share allows you to configure accounts and permissions to access files on the USB storage device.

#### To use Samba share:

- Click USB application on the left navigation panel and click the Servers Center icon
- 2. Click the Network place (Samba) Share tab.
- 3. Click Share with account. Click OK at the pop-up window.





 Click the Add button to create user accounts for users who will be accessing the USB storage device via Samba.

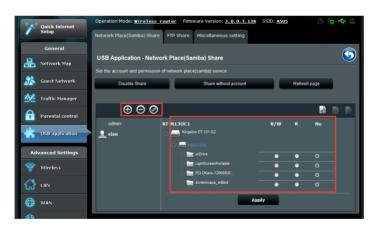

- 7. Select a user and assign the type of access rights for files or folders located in the storage device:
  - **R/W**: Select this option to assign read/write access for a specific file/folder.
  - R: Select this option to assign read only access for a specific file/folder.
  - No: Select this option if you do not want to share a specific file/folder.

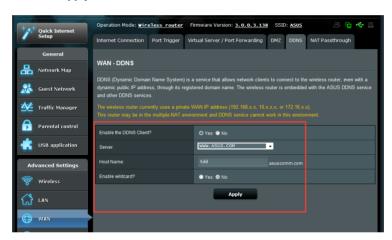




Your ASUS wireless router can set up the connected USB storage device as an FTP server.

#### To set up the FTP Share service:

- 1. Configure file sharing using the steps in Using AiDisk for File Sharing.
- 2. Enable the DDNS service for FTP server access:
  - a. Click WAN on the left navigation panel, then click the DDNS tab.
  - b. In the Enable the DDNS Client? field, tick Yes.
  - c. Select your DDNS Server from the list.
  - d. Key in your Host Name.
  - e. Click Apply.

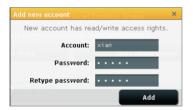

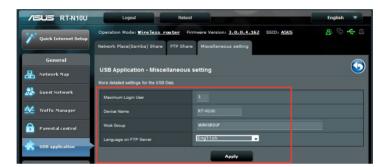

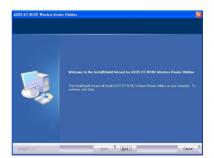
#### To install the utilities:

Device Discovery is an ASUS WLAN utility that detects an ASUS wireless router device, and enables you to configure the device.

### To launch the Device Discovery utility:

When you set the router to Access Point mode, you need to use Device Discovery to get the router's IP address.







Firmware Restoration is used on an ASUS Wireless Router after a failed firmware upgrade. This utility uploads a firmware file to the wireless router. The process takes about three to four minutes



Launch rescue mode before using the Firmware Restoration utility.

#### To launch rescue mode and use the Firmware Restoration utility:

- 1. Unplug the wireless router from its power source.
- While holding down the Reset button at the back of the wireless router, plug the wireless router into a power source. Release the Reset button when the Power LED at the front panel begins to flash slowly, which indicates that the wireless router is in rescue mode.
- 3. Use the following to set up your TCP/IP settings:

IP address: 192.168.1.x

Subnet mask: 255.255.255.0

4. From your computer's desktop, click

Start > All Programs > ASUS Utility RT-N10U Wireless Router > Firmware Restoration.



5. Click Browse to navigate to a firmware file, then click **Upload**.



The Firmware Restoration utility is not used to upgrade the firmware of a working ASUS Wireless Router. Normal firmware upgrades must be done through the web GUI. Refer to **Upgrading the firmware** on page 44 for more details.

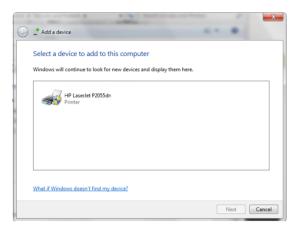

This troubleshooting guide provides solutions to some common problems that you may encounter while installing or using the ASUS Wireless Router. These problems require simple troubleshooting that you can perform by yourself. Contact the ASUS Technical Support if you encounter problems not mentioned in this chapter.

## **ASUS DDNS Service**

RT-N10U supports the ASUS DDNS service. When exchanging devices at the service center, if you have registered the ASUS DDNS service and want to keep the original domain name, you must transfer your data in order to retain the DDNS service. Visit your local service center for more information.



- If there is no activity in the domain such as reconfiguring the router or accessing the registered domain name - within 90 days, the system automatically deletes the registered integration.
- If you encounter any problem or difficulty in using your device, contact the service center.

### Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. Will the registered information be lost or registered by others?

If you have not updated the registered information in 90 days, the system automatically deletes the registered information and the domain name may be registered by others.

I did not register the ASUS DDNS for the router I bought six months ago. Can I still register it?

Yes, you can still register the ASUS DDNS service for your router. The DDNS service is embedded in your router, so you can register the ASUS DDNS service anytime. Before registering, click **Query** to check if the hostname has been registered or not. If not, the system registers the hostname automatically.

I have registered a domain name before and it has been working well until my friends told me that they could not access my domain name.

Check the following:

- 1. The internet is working properly.
- 2. The DNS server is working properly.
- 3. The last time you updated the domain name.

If there are still problems in accessing your domain name, contact the service center.

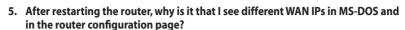
4. Can I register two domain names to access my http and ftp servers separately?

No, you cannot. You can only register one domain name for one router. Use port mapping to implement security in the network.

This is normal. The interval time between the ISP DNS server and ASUS DDNS results in different WAN IPs in MS-DOS and in the router configuration page. Different ISPs may have different interval time for IP updating.

#### 6. Is the ASUS DDNS service free, or is it just a trial version?

The ASUS DDNS service is a free and embedded service in some ASUS routers. Check if your ASUS router supports the ASUS DDNS service.

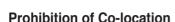

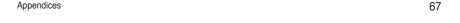

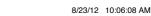
